Established in 1989, the Women's Center of Northwest Indiana (formally the Lake County Women's Center) is a non-for-profit organization whose goal is to show the love of Christ in our communities by tending to women who are considering or vulnerable to abortion. The Center promotes the value of unborn human life, and make available all the means necessary to

What is Indiana's Safe Haven Law?

The Indiana Safe Haven Law enables a person to give up an unwanted infant anonymously without fear of arrest or prosecution.

As long as there are no signs of intentional abuse on the baby, no information is required of the person leaving the baby.

Once the baby is examined and given any needed medical treatment, the Indiana Department of Child Services will take the baby into custody through Child Protective Services where it will be placed with a caregiver.

B ishop Emeritus Dale Melczek, D.D., who led Gary's Catholic Diocese for more than two decades, died on August 25, 2022 at age 83.

Melczek was born in Detroit in 1938. In June of 1964, he was ordained as a priest by Cardinal Dearden. John Paul II appointed Melczek as the third bishop of Gary on June 1, 1996. The Gary Diocese that covers four counties in northwest Indiana and it's about 160,000 Catholics.

The fifth and current of Bishop of Gary, Bishop Robert J. McClory described Bishop Melczek as a "true shepherd who loved his flock in the Diocese of Gary."

"He was a tireless servant and a compassionate pastor. We have been blessed tremendously to have such a hopeful and caring leader. Until his last days, Bishop Melczek was still looking forward for new ways to share the love of Jesus in Northwest Indiana," he added. "We now entrust him to the love of Jesus so that he may be drawn forward into the Lord's eternal embrace."

During is time, Bishop Melczek has served on many national and international committees and councils. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Human Values Committee, the Committee on Social Development the Committee on Marriage and the Family, and World Peace, International Policy, Administrative Board. While he was a member to the Board of Catholic Relief Services, Bishop Melczek made many summer trips on behalf of CRS from 1997 to 2002. He spent two weeks in the Philippines, visited Myanmar and Cambodia, visited the Catholic Relief Services' projects in Indonesia and East Timor and visited the Democratic Republic of Congo and Congo Brazzaville. He visited Angola and Tanzania.

From 2002-2005, he served as Chairman of the Bishops' Committee on the Laity.

Bishop Melczek also served as a member of the Joint Committee of Roman Catholic and Orthodox Bishops. He served the National Association of Catholic Chaplains as episcopal liaison from 2002-2007.

As co-chair of the Race Relations Council of Northwest Indiana, he two issued pastoral letters advocating diversity and denouncing racism in northwest Indiana; "The Many Faces of Our Church: a Pastoral Letter on Cultural Diversity" in 2002 and "Created in God's Image: a Pastoral Letter on the Sin of Racism and a Call to Conversion" in 2003.

Upon his retirement in November 2014, Bishop Melczek said he hoped to be remembered for taking steps fighting racism.

In his retirement, he served as administrator of the parish of St. Mary of the Lake in Gary.

He is interred in the east transept of the Cathedral of the Holy Angels.

those making hard decisions about the life of their unborn child, including free limited services like ultrasound examinations.

The Cardinal Stritch Council and the Indiana Knights of Columbus State Council, through Culture of Life Director Mike Velasco, with other benefactors assisted the Center with donations making it possible to purchase a new ultrasound for the Crown Point center.

Women's Center of Northwest Indiana director Jackie Moffitt said that with Crown Point getting a new ultrasound, it makes it possible another location to obtain an ultrasound. According to Ms. Moffitt, the new ultrasound was instrumental in changing the mind of the first client examined with it.

Shortly after the council helped the Women's Center, we were approached by Dave Crane, the Crown Point Fire Chief, who informed us that they were in the process of installing a Safe Haven Baby Box in the fire station.

Although the initial funding for the baby box project was made possible by a very generous donation from an anonymous donor, they needed one more sponsor to get donate the remaining funds for this installation to be completed. Council #4620 unanimously voted to donate to finish it.

The Crown Point Safe Haven Baby Box is the 19th Safe Haven Baby Box located in the state of Indiana and is the first box

installed with bilingual instructions.


"Once the mom shuts the door, the door will no longer open until we clear the alarm, so that no one in the meantime can take that infant out," said Crown Point Fire Chief Dave Crane. "When she opens the door there's a pamphlet that drops out and gives her information and gives her more choices and avenues for help."

Two months after being installed in the wall of the fire station, a healthy newborn baby was surrendered safely into the Crown Point Safe Haven Baby Box. At the time, it was the fourth baby surrendered in a baby box since 2017 according to Monica Kelsey, CEO and founder of Safe Haven Baby Boxes.

On August 31, 2020, Steve Strayer and his wife, Jennifer, officially adopted the baby, Charlotte Sue Ann Strayer.

Steve is the Crown Point High School varsity baseball head coach.

"She could have aborted her," Coach Strayer said. "We think this is a great thing. A lot of people that have abortions feel guilty afterward or wonder what the baby would've been like. There are a lot of people that want babies that can't have them. Her mom is the real hero. We give glory to God. We are fortunate. She's been a blessing to us. She's absolutely adorable."
